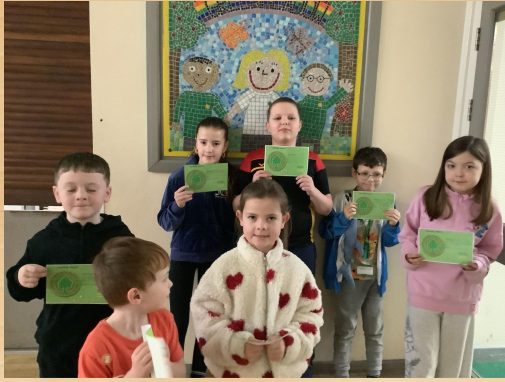

to bring their designs to life*





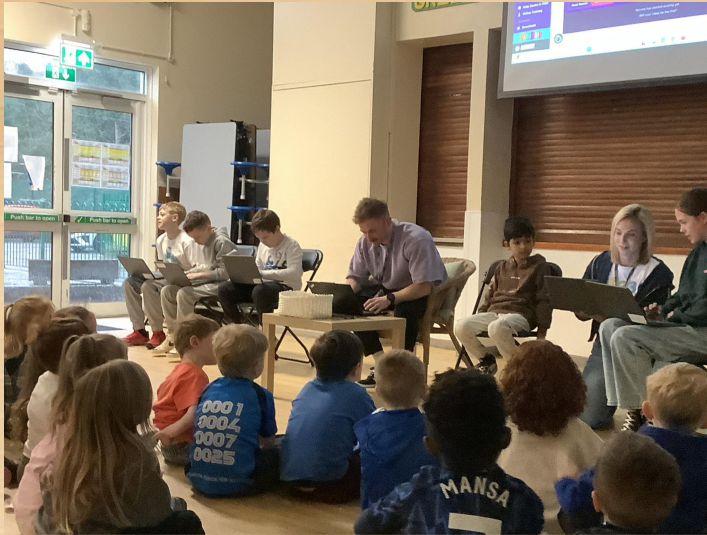
This Fortnight's Highlights: Year 6 Family engagement

This Fortnight's Highlights: The Den Family Engagement



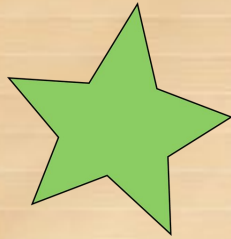
